

Year-long Eisenhower Series Focuses on National Security for a New Era

"National Security for a New Era – The Evolution of Cooperation, Competition and Conflict" is the theme of year-long events for the 2006 Eisenhower National Security Series starting this October. The 2006 Eisenhower Series will include a "Council on Foreign Relations;" workshop series on terrorism and "Stability and Reconstruction Operations;" and the Eisenhower Series College Program.

The Dwight D. Eisenhower National Security Series and Conference was established in 2002 by the Chief of Staff of the United States Army to address the critical security issues of our time. Audiences include current and former national security policymakers, senior military officials, congressional leaders, internationally recognized security specialists, corporate and industry leaders and the media.

The first Eisenhower Series event, "Irregular Challenges: Implications for the U.S. and Allied Force Transformation," takes place Oct. 4 from 9 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. in conjunction with the Association of the United States Army Annual Meeting at the Washington Convention Center. Rear Admiral Richard Cobbold, U.K. Royal Navy (Ret.), Director, Royal United Services Institute, London will moderate. Panelists include Major General (Ret.) J.B.A. Bailey, MBE, former Director General Doctrine & Development, British Army, and Major General Adriano Santini, Chief of the Logistics Department, Italian Army General Staff.
