Dr. Mia Bloom is an assistant professor of political science at the University of Cincinnati and consults for the Offices of Counter Terrorism and federal agencies. She has held research or teaching appointments at Princeton, Cornell, Harvard, and McGill Universities. Dr. Bloom has a PhD in political science from Columbia University, a Masters in Arab Studies from Georgetown University and a double honors Bachelors degree from McGill University in Russian History and Middle East Studies. She has received fellowships from the United States Institute of Peace and the MacArthur Foundation. Dr. Bloom speaks nine languages and began focusing on international terrorism in 1990. An expert on terror, martyrdom, rape in war and child soldiers, Bloom interviews terrorist leaders and would be bombers. Her work has been published in journals and newspapers including the LA Times, Political Science Quarterly, and Civil Wars. Her recent book is entitled: *Dying to Kill: The Allure of Suicide Terror* published with Columbia University Press. Her next book project investigates the phenomena of rape and war in Darfur, Bangladesh, Rwanda, and Bosnia and is entitled: *Gendercide*. Her media appearances include the newshour with Jim Lehrer, CBC, Fox News, NPR, XM Satellite, Nightline, and the Al Franken Show.
