Kim Cragin is an international policy analyst at RAND Corporation. Since joining RAND in September 2000, Kim has focused on issues concerning the history of political violence. Her RAND publications include *Terrorism and Development*, *Arms Trafficking and Colombia*, *The Dynamic Terrorist Threat* and *Dissuading Terror*. Kim has managed the RAND Terrorism Chronology since April 2001. In addition to her work for RAND, Kim is a PhD candidate at Cambridge University's Faculty of History; her dissertation research traces the transformation of Hamas in Palestinian society, beginning in 1973 with its roots in the Muslim Brotherhood through the January 2006 elections. Kim has conducted fieldwork in the West Bank and Gaza Strip, Israel, Lebanon, Egypt, Jordan, Colombia, the United Kingdom, China, Indonesia, Thailand, Malaysia, Singapore and the Philippines.
