



Christopher C. Harmon, Ph.D. **Adjunct for Terrorism and Counterterrorism**



Christopher C. Harmon wrote his doctoral dissertation about terrorism and has been publishing on aspects of the subject ever since.

Harmon served for four years as a foreign policy advisor to a member of the House Armed Services Committee. He has taught strategy for over four years at the Naval War College. Since 1993 he has been professor of international relations at the Command and Staff College, Marine Corps University, where he now directs the core courses on strategy and policy." Harmon speaks and writes on terrorism and counterterrorism as an individual scholar, not as a representative of the United States Government.

Harmon most recent book, *Terrorism Today*, was published in London. The *Times* Literary Supplement called it "a masterly survey of the big picture of world violence." The book has been lauded by such publications as the *Naval Intelligence Professionals Quarterly*, the Army's *Parameters*, and is a textbook in several colleges and graduate schools.

Over many years, Harmon has spoken on terrorism at such locations as the George Marshal Center in Garmish, Germany, the Institute of World Politics in Washington, and several dozen other universities, graduate schools and military schools. After September 11, he testified before Congress. The State Department presented him with a "Distinguished Public Service Award." His lecture on that occasion appeared in the journal *Vital Speeches* and was cabled to American embassies around the world.
